### Process Timeline

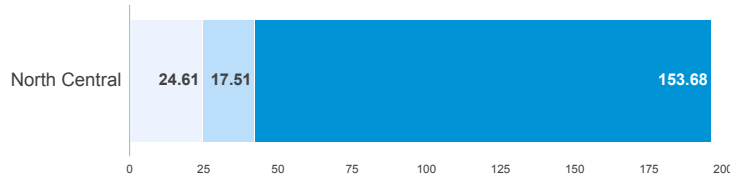

#### DELINQUENT BEHAVIOR

Across the state, Delinquent Behavior was reported as a reason for referral for 60% of the 1,883 intakes and/or referrals made in SFY25.

### Incident Type

Statewide roughly 43% of the 1,883 confirmed SFY25 entries were resulting from incidents categorized as Breach of Peace for primary or secondary incident type. 19% of all SFY25 intakes or referrals were incidents reported involving Assault.

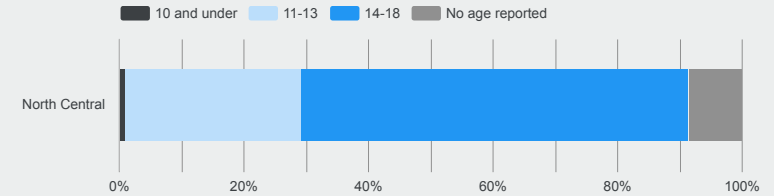
